Please continue to be in prayer for all of our church family and our pastor as we continue our work and as we look to the future of our church. ~ Nancy Miller, Clerk of Session






You did it again, First

CONGREGATIONAL FELLOWSHIP






Join us for another family friendly event. Anyone is welcome

The First Presbyterian Church book club will hold the November meeting the second Thursday, November 9th, at 2:00pm in the church parlor. The book we will be discussing reflects what is happening in the Middle East today. The book selection for November is *No Ordinary Assignment: A Memoir* by Jane Ferguson. The author is a special correspondent for *PBS News Hour* and has been a visiting professor of war reporting at Princeton University. Ferguson's book chronicles her unlikely journey from bright, inquisitive child in war torn Northern Ireland to intrepid war correspondent. Without family wealth or connections, she began as a one-woman reporting team, a borrowed camera her

only equipment. While other reporters chased "bang-bang shoot'em up" stories, she sought to give voice to civilian experiences of war. With this goal in mind, she has covered nearly every war front and humanitarian crisis of our time. One reviewer of her book wrote that "Jane Ferguson's breathtaking memoir takes us inside the savage

her book wrote that "Jane Ferguson's breathtaking memoir takes us inside the savage wars of the last two decades with a greater immediacy and compassion than any news report".

The book selection for December is *Bill of Obligation* by Richard Haas. Once again the group has been invited to Dick and Arlene Mueller's home to partake of Christmas cheer and goodies as we discuss our December book selection. This is a fun event that we look forward to every year.






ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL



FELLOWSHIP SUNDAY SCHOOL





We are studying Revelations of Christ by Yogananda. This group


